

NARRABRI LATERAL PIPELINE


PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Narrabri Lateral Pipeline (NLP) is a proposed underground gas pipeline that will connect the Narrabri Gas Project to the existing NSW gas transmission network via the Hunter Gas Pipeline (HGP).

Santos has committed 100 per cent of Narrabri gas to the east coast domestic market, helping secure future gas supply and put downward pressure on gas and electricity prices for households, manufacturers and businesses. The project has been designed to minimise impacts on local communities, landholders and the environment. The pipeline will be buried underground with some limited above-ground infrastructure.

Location

The NLP is in Narrabri Shire in north-west NSW, within the traditional Country of the Kamilaroi (Gomeri) People. The pipeline will start at the Leewood gas processing facility (about 20 km south-west of Narrabri), run south-east via the Bibblewindi facility, and tie into the approved HGP (about 5.5 km south-east of Baan Baa). The total pipeline length is approximately 55 kilometres.

Approvals and assessment

The NLP is a major infrastructure project under NSW law. An Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) was developed to assess the potential environmental, economic and social impacts and benefits of the project. The EIS was publicly exhibited from 20 November to 18 December 2025. The project will also be assessed by the Australian Government under national environmental laws, in coordination with the NSW Government.
